May the heroes we celebrate today inspire each one of us to act with purpose and make a lasting difference in the lives of fellow Kenyans.





CATEGORIES FROM WHICH HEROES ARE IDENTIFIED FROM

Liberation Struggle

Heroes in the liberation struggle embody unwavering patriotism, courage and sacrifice in the fight for Kenya's freedom. Through their acts of resilience and defiance against oppression, they inspired unity and ignited the spirit of self-determination. Their legacy safeguards the nation's sovereignty, preserves the memory of those who fought for independence and continues to strengthen Kenya's identity and pride.

Peacemaking

Heroes in peacemaking champion dialogue, reconciliation and unity in the face of conflict. With wisdom, integrity and courage, they create pathways for healing, bridging divides across communities and generations. Their efforts foster harmony, safeguard human dignity and inspire lasting stability. Such heroes leave behind a legacy of hope and resilience, reinforcing Kenya's values of peace, coexistence and national cohesion.

Scholarship, Professionalism and Research

Heroes honoured in this category contribute to expanding the body of

knowledge in a particular field in theory and practice through outstanding professionalism, scholarship, research and technological innovation with a positive impact to the society. This includes an individual's contribution to the formulation, advancement and application of curriculum, standards, policies, principles used to guide the development and application of a certain discipline. It also includes training, knowledge exchange and mentorship of upcoming scholars and professionals for continued achievement of exemplary results.

Philanthropy

Heroes honoured in this category, undertake actions or programmes to improve lives of the less privileged and or marginalised members of the society. Their actions enable the less privileged access basic needs and services, access to skills and opportunities for improved self-reliance. Such actions of philanthropy must be motivated by selflessness, empathy and generosity for the greater good of the society.

Arts

Heroes in this category embody



patriotism, creativity and innovation, using their talent to inspire and unite. Through works that challenge norms and address social issues, they foster cultural dialogue while showcasing Kenya's identity. Their art preserves heritage, sparks change and brings national and international recognition to the country.

Human Rights

Heroes in this category demonstrate integrity, courage and advocacy and advance justice and equality. Such individuals inspire hope by creating awareness of human rights issues while innovating and implementing solutions that protect dignity and freedom. Their work embodies resilience and inspiration, uniting communities in the pursuit of fairness and leaving a legacy that strengthens Kenya's democratic values and humanity.

Indigenous Knowledge

This category recognises individuals who have dedicated their lives to preserving, practising and passing on traditional knowledge and wisdom. These heroes embody a deep connection to heritage, language, environmental stewardship and cultural practices. Through their efforts, traditional knowledge continues

to thrive in the modern world, inspiring new generations and strengthening community identity.

Cultural Values and Practices

Heroes in this category undertake the preservation and promotion of cultural values, which serve as a powerful reminder of our identity and heritage. These individuals demonstrate unwavering commitment to cultural heritage thus inspiring generations and strengthening the fabric of our community. Through their tireless efforts, they nurture traditions, promote inclusivity and safeguard the richness of our shared identity.

Entrepreneurship and Industry

Heroes in this category embody vision, innovation and resilience in driving Kenya's economic transformation. Through enterprise, creativity and hard work, they create opportunities, generate employment and strengthen national self-reliance. Their legacy empowers future generations to embrace novelty, foster sustainable development, and elevate Kenya's standing in the global marketplace.

Spiritual Leadership

Heroes in this category embody faith,



integrity and compassion in guiding society through moral and ethical challenges. By nurturing hope, unity and resilience, they inspire communities to uphold values that safeguard human dignity and social harmony. Their legacy provides moral grounding, strengthens the nation's spiritual fabric and fosters peace, justice and cohesion across Kenya.

Sports

Heroes in this category demonstrate patriotism, discipline and excellence, raising Kenya's profile on the global stage through talent and determination. By breaking barriers, inspiring teamwork and achieving milestones, they unite the nation in pride and belief. Their legacy fosters resilience, empowers the youth and preserves Kenya's tradition of sporting greatness while nurturing future champions.

Environmental Conservation

Heroes in this category safeguard Kenya's natural heritage for present and future generations. With wisdom, courage and innovation, they lead efforts in conservation, sustainability, and climate action.

Their actions protect biodiversity,

preserve ecosystems and inspire collective responsibility. These heroes leave behind a legacy of resilience and harmony with nature, strengthening Kenya's values of stewardship, balance, and shared prosperity.

Statesmanship

This category honours respected, experienced, wise leaders who serve the public with integrity, vision and a long-term perspective. They are persons who are principled, thoughtful and willing to make sacrifices and difficult decisions for the benefit of society as a whole.

Their actions promote diplomacy and international relations and contribute to the nation's political stability while transforming the social, political and economic lives of the people. They display a high level of patriotism, wisdom, dedication, leadership and diplomacy.

National Cohesion and Integration

Heroes in this category are those who have fostered the inclusion of special interest groups. Their actions inspire unity, nurture a sense of belonging and transform diversity into a pillar of social cohesion.

Hon. Gitu wa Kahengeri, OGW - (Male) KIAMBU COUNTY

Hon. Gitu is being honoured for his contribution to the liberation struggle. In 1950, he took an oath in support of the Mau Mau freedom movement. He spent nearly seven years in Athi River and Manda Island detention camps where he was tortured and denied food. He recently launched his memoir, The Betrayal of Mau Mau Freedom Fighters.

Muchiri M'Mwitha - (Male) THARAKA-NITHI COUNTY

Muchiri is being honoured for his contribution to the liberation struggle by supplying food and water to the freedom fighters while in the forest. He was actively involved in mapping hide outs and escape routes to evade colonialist invasion.



M'kanga Mwararia Emilio - (Male) THARAKA-NITHI COUNTY

Mwararia is being honoured for his contribution to the liberation struggle by leading in operational logistics and oath taking that ensured solidarity and team work in the Mau Mau struggle in Lower Mt Kenya Ndigia Forest.

Lucia Cianjoka Leonard - (Female) THARAKA-NITHI COUNTY

Lucia is being honoured for her role in the liberation struggle. As a commander, she directed operations and sustained morale for fellow freedom fighters. Using her knowledge of the forest terrain, she was able to map escape routes from areas prone to colonial raids in lower Mt Kenya.

Dorcas Kibura Ngahu - (Female) MURANG'A - NITHI COUNTY

Dorcas is being recognised for her contribution to the liberation struggle. She was involved in cooking and delivering food together with intelligence information to the Mau Mau fighters. She also took care of injured Mau Mau who sought help from villagers.



Harisson Githaiga Githaibi -

(Male) MURANG'A COUNTY

Githaibi is being honoured for courageously taking part in the Kenya's liberation struggle. He stood firm against colonial oppression and dedicated his life to the pursuit of freedom, justice and dignity for the people of Kenya. As a member of the Mau Mau movement, he endured immense personal sacrifice, including persecution, displacement, detention and loss, yet remained steadfast in the vision of an independent nation.

Hon. Fanuel Walter Odede - (Male) SIAYA COUNTY

Hon. Odede is being honored posthumously for his contribution towards the liberation struggle. After the arrest of the famous Kapenguria Six, he stepped up with Pio Gama Pinto, Joseph Murumbi and Wycliffe Works Wasia Awori and raised funds for their successful defence.



Stephen Nyang'or Aloo - (Male) SIAYA COUNTY

Nyang'or Aloo is being honoured posthumously for his role in the liberation struggle. He supported the Mau Mau movement through his position in the police force. This led to his dismissal from the force and detention for seven years by the British administration.

Haji Galma Dido - (Male) ISIOLO COUNTY

Dido is being honoured posthumously for his contribution during the struggle for independence in the Northern region and Kenya at large. As a Senior Chief, he worked closely with Mzee Jomo Kenyatta ensuring that peace existed in the region and that it did not secede to Somalia. He was assassinated together with the first Isiolo District Commissioner, David Dabaso Wabera, by Shifta rebels while on a peace mission to Sericho.

Githae wa Kiguru - (Male) KIAMBU COUNTY

Githae is being honoured posthumously for his participation in the Mau Mau liberation struggle. He was involved in advising freedom fighters. He equally sacrificed his wealth to support Mau Mau freedom fighters.



Njeri wa Ndugo - (Female) KIAMBU COUNTY

Njeri is being honoured posthumously for her contribution to the liberation struggle. She participated in the resistance against British colonial powers. She was part of the Kikuyu Central Association, a special purpose vehicle used to garner support for liberation struggle against the oppressive colonial Government. She persevered brutal torture by the colonial administrators and home guards during her detention in colonial camps.

Kirongothi wa Ndegwa - (Male) KIAMBU COUNTY

Kirongothi is being honoured posthumously for his role in the liberation struggle. He participated in the resistance against British colonial power. He was part of the Kikuyu Central Association, a special purpose vehicle used to garner support for liberation struggle against the oppressive colonial Government. He persevered brutal torture by the colonial administrators and home guards during his detention in colonial camps.

Gatabaki wa Mundati - (Male) KIAMBU COUNTY

Gatabaki is being honoured posthumously for his role in the liberation struggle. He resisted British colonial power. He was among the founders of Kikuyu Central Association, a special purpose vehicle used to garner support for the liberation struggle against the oppressive colonial government. He persevered brutal torture by the colonial administrators and home guards during his detention in colonial camps.



Nabii Lukas Pkech - (Male) WEST POKOT COUNTY

Nabii Pkech is being feted posthumously for his role in Kenya's early liberation struggle through spiritual resistance to the colonial rule. As a Pokot elder and devoted follower of the Dini ya Msambwa movement, he boldly defended African identity and indigenous leadership. His death during the 1950 Kolloa Massacre marked a powerful act of defiance, making him a martyr in the fight against colonial oppression.



Chief Ng'eleyo Wero Tomele - (Male) BARINGO COUNTY

Chief Ngoleyo is being feted posthumously for his role in Kenya's early liberation struggle through spiritual resistance to the colonial rule. As an elder and devoted follower of the Dini ya Msambwa movement, he stood firm in defending African identity and indigenous leadership. His death during the 1950 Kolloa Massacre marked a powerful act of defiance, making him a martyr in the fight against colonial oppression.

Judy Mwende Mutunga - (Female) MAKUENI COUNTY

Mutunga is being honoured for her contribution to entrepreneurship through her innovation as the founder of Ustawi Foods company. This company is involved in the development of nutritious fortified flours and food products using orange- fleshed sweet potatoes, effectively addressing critical challenges of malnutrition and Vitamin A deficiency.

David Wambua Joel Masika, OGW - (Male) MAKUENI COUNTY

David is recognised as an industrial leader, visionary public servant, agribusiness innovator and a pioneer in Kenya's real estate and valuation landscape. He championed vital infrastructure projects, including the construction of Masinga and Kiambere dams, irrigation systems and community driven livestock initiatives in agribusiness sector. He revived Makueni Ginneries Limited and turned it into a model of profitability and rural empowerment.



F A James Wangunyu - (Male) KIAMBU COUNTY

Wangunyu is recognised for his transformative leadership in capital markets and investment banking. As founder and Managing Director of Standard Investment Bank, he spearheaded landmark transactions worth over Sh250 billion, launched the Mansa-X Fund managing over Sh70 billion, and introduced Kenya's first Islamic investment banking division. His vision has shaped the growth and inclusivity of Kenya's financial sector.

Victor B Otieno Maura - (Male) SIAYA COUNTY

Maura is being recognised for his unwavering contribution to initiating and establishing a palm oil pressing unit at his home in Siaya County. He has boosted local economic growth, created jobs for the youth and improved livelihoods within the community. His innovation in agro-processing has strengthened inter-county economic linkages and stands as a model for sustainable development and empowerment.

F A Dr Luke Mwiti Kinoti - (Male) MERU COUNTY

Dr Kinotiis being feted for his contribution to the advancement of entrepreneurship, industry and economic development in the country and beyond. His key initiatives include cofounding one of Africa's and Kenya's pioneering private equity (Fusion Capital Group) through which more than Sh200 billion was mobilised in foreign investments between 2006 and 2017. Through this, more than 350 companies received direct equity and debt investment and thousands of jobs were created.



Fatuma Abubakar Abdalla Elmaawy -

(Female) MOMBASA COUNTY

Fatma is being honoured for her outstanding contribution to entrepreneurship, ethical business and community empowerment. As a master trainer, she has equipped startups, small and medium-sized enterprises (SME), universities and marginalised groups, including teen mothers with skills for growth and self-reliance locally and regionally. She has championed ethical business practices and continues to inspire women, youth and businesses to drive sustainable economic development with integrity.

Tobias Ouma Alando - (Male) SIAYA COUNTY

Alando is recognised for his exemplary leadership and innovation in the entrepreneurship and industry sector. He has championed policies to strengthen Kenya's manufacturing sector, fostered Government industry collaboration, and driven sustainable economic growth. He has spearheaded key initiatives, including the Women in Manufacturing Programme, the SME Hub and the Technical and Vocational Education and Training Programme, all aimed at empowering women, nurturing SMEs, and bridging skills gaps.

Julius Festus Mutinda Munene - (Male) MACHAKOS COUNTY

Munene is being recognised for his contribution to entrepreneurship and industry through his innovative work in creating an affordable and durable composite dam liner. This innovation has significantly benefited small scale farmers by reducing plastic pollution, carbon footprints and creating jobs through the recycling of cement bags.



Charles Maina Thuo - (Male) KAJIADO COUNTY

Thuo is being honoured for his outstanding contribution to entrepreneurship and logistics innovation. As founder and CEO of Apexloads, he is driving the formalisation and digitisation of freight logistics in East Africa. Charles developed the region's first digital credential verification system for logistics providers, addressing regulatory and trust gaps. Through collaboration, forums and platform demos, he has championed industry engagement while helping formalise informal logistics showcasing the power of locally driven innovation.

Salat is being honoured for his exceptional leadership in entrepreneurship and industry. Dr Dianah Wanjiku Kamande, HSC - (Female) MURAN'GA COUNTY

Dr Kamande is being honoured for her contribution to gender and equity advocacy as the founder and Executive Director of "Come Together Widows and Orphans Organisation" where she has served for more than 12 years. She has advocated for social inclusion and protection of widows and children in areas of economic empowerment as well as access to health and justice.



Philip Kiprono Muge - (Male) KERICHO COUNTY

Muge is being feted for his contribution to promotion of human rights. He promotes mobility, independence and dignity for persons with disabilities by coordinating distribution of wheelchairs. His tireless efforts have provided essential support to individuals facing physical barriers enabling their participation in education, employment and community life.



Ebei Benson Ewoi - (Male) TURKANA COUNTY

Ewoi is being honoured for his contribution towards protection and promotion of human rights for people with disabilities in Turkana County. Daniel Mutai - (Male) BOMET COUNTY

Tabitha is being honoured for her contribution towards protection and promotion of human rights for people with disabilities in Kajiado County. She has been involved in awareness creation and advocacy programmes, which have resulted to many learners and persons with disabilities accessing education and financial support from the Government and other sponsors hence leading to the improvement of their lives.



Fatuma Ibrahim Hakar - (Female) GARISSA COUNTY

Fatuma is being feted for her outstanding contribution to the defense of human rights. As a fearless defender of justice and dignity, she is dedicated to fighting female genital mutilation (FGM), early child marriages and gender-based violence. Through her work with GirlKind Kenya, Fatuma has empowered girls and families across Northern Kenya to reclaim their rights, pursue education and live in dignity.

Yasmin Mohammed Nassur - (Female) NAIROBI COUNTY

Issah Mmari Wangui - (Male) WAJIR COUNTY



Dr Christopher Kiprotich Kiptoo, CBS

(Male) ELGEYO MARAKWET COUNTY

Dr Kiptoo is being honoured for his contribution to environmental conservation. He founded The Kaptagat Integrated Conservation Program (KICP) as a way of responding to deforestation and degradation in the Kaptagat forest ecosystem in conjunction with the local community. This initiative has strengthened ecological resilience, preserved habitats and created a sustainable future for forest-edge communities. Through KICP, over 2,765 hectares of degraded forest have been restored, and more than 300,000 high value avocado trees have been planted, benefitting over 28,000 households. KICP has also promoted eco-friendly farming and use of clean energy thus reducing reliance on forests.

Caleb Ambulwa Burudi - (Male) KAKAMEGA COUNTY

Burudi is being honoured for his contribution to spearheading tree planting campaigns nationwide, planting over 2 million trees and establishing nurseries to support Kenya's 15 billion tree target by 2032. His efforts include tree planting initiatives in Kirimum, Samburu County and a tree for peace project along the borders of Kakamega, Nandi, Uasin Gishu and Vihiga counties. These projects have restored critical ecosystems, such as the Kakamega Forest, while promoting peace and sustainability. By donating over 100,000 seedlings, he has significantly advanced ecological restoration in areas like Kerarapon, Kisaju and Enchan in Kajiado County.
